Keynote Speaker: Dr. Kristine Pytash

Kristine E. Pytash is an Associate Professor in the School of Teaching, Learning and Curriculum Studies at Kent State University, where she directs the Secondary Integrated Language Arts Teacher Preparation program. She is a former high school English teacher. Her research focuses on the literacy practices of youth in juvenile detention facilities, disciplinary



writing, and how to prepare teachers to teach writing. An underlying theme across all her lines of inquiry is how technology influences young adults' literacy practices and their literacy instruction.
